- BCAT Self-Assessment of Cognition, BCAT Driving Self-Assessment, and BCAT Power Mobility Self-Assessment. <https://www.thebcat.com/self-assessment-tools>
- Brief Cognitive Rating Scale (BCRS). Use with the GDS to determine dementia rating. <https://bit.ly/2xdC6ba>
- Brief Evaluation of Executive Function: Controlled Oral Word Association Test, Royall's CLOX Clock Drawing Task, and the Trail Making Test Part B, Oral Version. <https://bit.ly/2XtW6oJ>
- Dementia Severity Rating Scale. Multiple-choice questionnaire to rate severity. <https://bit.ly/2x6aTHE>
- Functional Assessment Staging (FAST). Use with the GDS to determine dementia rating. <https://bit.ly/2YgZOPG>
- Functional Activities Questionnaire. Caregiver rates a person's ability to handle 10 common activities (dementia). <https://bit.ly/2ZDZZ8f>
- Global Deterioration Scale (GDS). Use with BCRS and FAST to determine dementia stage. <https://bit.ly/2NhtqMa>
- Informant Questionnaire on Cognitive Decline in the Elderly (IQCODE). Caregiver compares the individual's abilities today with how they were 10 years ago in 16 areas. (dementia) <https://bit.ly/2xcGuat>
- Lawton-Brody Instrumental Activities of Daily Living Scale (IADL). Older adult is rated in eight different areas. <https://bit.ly/2x9USjl>
- Neuro-QoL Short Form v2.0. Patient completes this self-assessment which you can compare to norms. <https://bit.ly/2J3aiMi>
- Self-Administered Gerocognitive Exam (SAGE). Self-assessment for older adults. <https://bit.ly/2N6C53R>
- Short Blessed Test (Orientation-Memory-Concentration Test). Sensitive screening tool used to detect cognitive impairment in older people. <https://bit.ly/2IZQ6Lk>

- St. Louis University Mental Status Exam (SLUMS). Screening tool for adults. Requires free yearly online training. <https://bit.ly/2Rvf88W>
- Iowa Trail Making Test (TMT). Assess 'visual search, scanning, speed of processing, mental flexibility, and executive functions.' <https://bit.ly/2KxDuyk>
